



Detox assistance and support program (DASP)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Mission

To provide shelter
for individuals who require
detoxification services.

The maximum stay
is 48 hours.

Eligible target population

The service users targeted by the program include:

- Adult men and women (18 years and over) who are mainly,
but not exclusively, homeless or experiencing housing instability;
- **Individuals who are mildly or moderately intoxicated.**

Mild-to-moderate intoxication is defined as follows:

- Use of psychoactive substances (such as alcohol, opioids,
cannabis, major stimulants, cocaine, hallucinogens
(acid, mushrooms, GHB, etc.)) within the **previous 6 hours**;
- Able to communicate and move around safely
without assistance;
- Able to take care of basic needs (bathing, eating,
using the toilet, getting dressed);
- Does not require any specific withdrawal support;
- Does not require a medical assessment
or immediate medical attention;
- Not experiencing a suicidal crisis
(risk of suicide attempt within the next 48 hours);
- Not a danger to others (no signs of imminent
hetero-aggressive behaviour);
- Agrees to be admitted to the temporary shelter.

Referral method

The referring person must contact the shelter, which will check
if a bed is available. The shelter must confirm the person’s eligibi-
lity with a brief telephone call to make sure their profile and situation
correspond to the DASP admission criteria.
